IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR BUYERS

- Introduction: The following informative notes are intended to assist Buyers, particularly those inexperienced or new to our salerooms. All sales are conducted on our printed 'Conditions of sale' which are readily available for inspection and normally accompany catalogues. Our staff will be happy to help you if there is anything you do not fully understand.
- Agency: As auctioneers we usually contract as agents for the seller whose identity, for reasons of confidentiality, is not normally disclosed. Accordingly, if you buy your primary contract is with the seller.
- 3. Estimates: Estimates are designed to help buyers gauge what sort of sum might be involved for the purchase of a particular lot. The lower estimate may represent the reserve price and certainly will not be below it. Estimates do not include the buyer's premium or VAT (where chargeable). Estimates are prepared some time before the sale and may be altered by announcement before the sale. They are in no sense definitive.
- 4. Buyers premium: The 'Conditions of sale' oblige buyers to pay a buyer's premium at 17.5% on the hammer price of each lot purchased with a minimum of £1 per lot. In the case of lots purchased 'Live On-line' or via www.thesaleroom.com or www.i-bidder.com this will charged at 22.5% on the hammer price. In addition, VAT is payable on this premium (see below).
- 5. VAT: No lots in this sale are subject to VAT.
- 6. Condition and description of lots. We are primarily, agents for the seller. We are dependent on information provided by the seller and whilst we may inspect lots and act reasonably in taking a general view about them we are normally unable to carry out a detailed or any examination of lots in order to ascertain their condition in the way in which it would be wise for a buyer to do. Intending buyers have ample opportunity for inspection of goods and, therefore, accept responsibility for inspecting and investigating lots in which they may be interested. Please note carefully the exclusion of liability for the condition of lots contained in the 'Conditions of sale'. Neither the seller nor we, as the auctioneers, accept any responsibility for their condition. In particular, mechanical objects of any age are not guaranteed to be in working order.

However, in so far as we have examined the goods and make a representation about their condition, we shall be liable for any defect which that examination ought to have revealed to the auctioneer but which would not have been revealed to the buyer had the buyer examined the goods. Additionally, in specified circumstances lots misdescribed because they are 'deliberate forgeries' may be returned and repayment made. There is a 21 day time limit from the date of sale, not date of collection or receipt. (The expression 'deliberate forgery' is defined in our 'Conditions of sale').

- 7. Electrical goods: Items are tested by a qualified electrician for SAFETY ONLY. An item that passes the PAT safety test may not work. Conversely, an item that fails the test may work with just minor repair. Working Order' and 'Safe' are two completely different concepts. The only thing you may take for granted is that the item will be safe at the point of sale. Items that have failed will have their cabling cut to source, labelled and sold 'For Trade Only'. To use the object you will have to change it radically from what was sold to you. Therefore, the Auctioneers cannot be held responsible after the point of sale. Those items sold genuinely as 'antiques or collectables' will not have been tested and if bought for use must be checked over for compliance with safety regulations by a qualified electrician before use. This is an express condition.
- Export of goods: Buyers intending to export goods should ascertain (a) whether an export licence is required and (b) whether there is any specific prohibition on importing goods of that character because, e.g. they may contain prohibited materials such as ivory. Ask us if you need help.
- Bidding in person: Some form of identification with proof of address will be required if you are unknown to us. Bidders may be required to register before the sale

- commences and lots will be invoiced to the name and address on the registration form. Account transfers will not be recognised or facilitated under any circumstances.
- 10. Absentee bidding: Commission bids may be left with the auctioneers indicating the maximum amount to be bid excluding buyers' premium. They will be executed as cheaply as possible having regard to the reserve (if any) and competing bids. If two buyers submit identical commission bids, the auctioneers may prefer the first bid received. If there are genuine reasons why you are unable to leave a Commission Bid and you wish to bid by telephone we may accommodate on lots where you opening bid will be £500 or above. There are inherent dangers with this practice; therefore all arrangements shall be entirely at the bidder's risk. Absentee bid instructions must be received by telephone, fax or email 12 hours prior to the sale.
- Live Internet Bidding: In completing the bidder registration on www.the-saleroom.com and providing your credit card details and unless alternative arrangements are agreed with Golding Young & Co and/or Thos. Mawer & Son, you
 - (i) authorise Golding Young & Co and/or Thos. Mawer & Son, if they so wish, to charge the credit card given in part or full payment, including all fees, for items successfully purchased in the sale via www.thesaleroom.com or www.i-bidder.com, and
 - (ii) confirm that you are authorised to provide these credit card details to Golding Young & Co and/or Thos. Mawer & Son through www.the-saleroom.com or www.i-bidder.com
- Methods of payment: Accounts are due for settlement SALEDAY.

The following methods of payment are acceptable.

There will be NO EXCEPTIONS to this policy.

To avoid undue embarrassment for yourself or our staff, please do not ask for preferential treatment.

- i. Cash. Single payments up to £10,000 only.
- ii. Debit Card. No limit with chip & pin. (CNP limit £500).
- Credit Card. (Fee of 2%+vat) No limit with chip & pin. (CNP limit £500).
- iv. Bank Drafts & Building Society Cheques. No limit. Due to forgeries, we will retain the goods for 3 working days to establish clearance of funds.
- Cheques. Accepted up to the limit of the guarantee card for immediate clearance. For sums exceeding this, and you are not known to the auctioneers, we will retain the goods for 7 working days to establish clearance of funds.

- 1001. A pair of George II brass candlesticks, with knopped stems and petal bases, each stamped George Grove, c1740, 19.5cm high.
- 1002. A Victorian cast brass ink well, in the form of an owl standing on a circular plinth 'leafing' through a book with Latin script, the hinged head with glass eyes opening to reveal a brass mounted glass resevoir, 23.5cm high.
- 1003. A 19thC mahogany table top letter box, in the form of a Georgian bureau, with dummy drawers to the front and the hinged fall opening to reveal the letter slot and collection times on a glazed sliding plinth base door, 26.5cm high, 29.5cm wide.
- 1004. A George III mahogany tea caddy, the moulde i lid with a brass loop handle, shaped brass key plate, and on bracket feet, 25cm wide.
- 1005. An 18thC Sevres biscuit group of two lovers eating grapes, seated against a tree-stump encrusted with a fruiting vine and with a Spaniel at their feet, entitled 'Les Mangeurs de Raisin', and further incised 'Bachelier', and '1779' to the base, with impressed Sevres mark, on a detachable shaped ormolu plinth, 25cm high overall. Catalogue Note: This group was designed by Jean-Jaques Bachelier (1724-1806), after Francois Boucher. Jean-Jaques Bachelier was appointed Art Director at Vincennes in 1751, and invented this type of biscuit porcelain. Naturally he became the first of the sculptors at Sevres to favour the use of biscuit porcelain for such decorative figural pieces.
- 1006. An 18thC silver-gilt apostle spoon, with plain oval bowl and apostle terminal, indistinct marks possibly for London 1749, 1.5ozs.
- 1007. A George III silver seal top spoon by Hester Bateman, with plain egg shaped bowl and plain seal terminal, London 1809.
- 1008. A 19thC chinoiserie tea caddy, in the Regency manner, on carved gilt feet, 21cm wide.
- 1009. A Lineol tin plate German car, with three composition figures, painted in camouflage colours, with a clockwork motor, 24cm long. (lacking windscreen).
- 1010. A collection of fifty grand tour plaster intaglios, contained within a two layer box, each numbered and bound in yellow paper, the inner lid bearing a printed label inscribed Chez Thomas Cade......, Rue due Cours xxx Rome, box size 25cm x 16cm.
- 1011. A Meiji period Japanese bronze charger, decorated with seated and dancing figures amongst peony, within a wide scrolling border, signed on a gilt tablet, 39cm diameter. 
- 1012. A Meiji period Japanese iron dish, with quail amongst grass in relief, circa 1860, 33cm diameter. Provenance: Acquired by Sir Guy Lawrence on the 13th September 1976 and is accompanied by a purchase receipt in the sum of £450.

A Meiji period Japanese iron dish by Komai, decorated with eight roundels depicting assorted plant life, the central panel having a temple scene at Kyoto, signed verso 'Komai, Kyoto', circa 1870, 30cm diameter. Provenance: Acquired by Sir Guy Lawrence on the 16th March 1982 and is accompanied by a purchase receipt in the sum of £900.
- 1014. A pair of late 19thC Chinese bronze baluster two handled vases, the flared rims with lappet decoration, the bases entwined with dragons, 12.5cm high.
- 1015. A pair of Chinese bronze baluster vases, decorated with dragons in relief, with impressed nine character seal marks to the bases, 15cm high, together with a pair of Satsuma vases enamelled and gilt with warriors and blossoms, 25cm high. (4).

How to find the Grantham Auction Rooms




The Grantham Auction Rooms are in Old Wharf Road, just south of Grantham town centre. Approaching from the A1 or the A607 from Melton Mowbray, go under the A1 dual carriageway and on to the next junction. The junction has a railway viaduct over. Old Wharf Road is immediately sharp left just under the viaduct and just before the junction.

However, whichever direction you approach Grantham, you can find us if you observe the following rules: Follow signs for Town Centre. Follow signs for Railway Station. At the junction leading to "Station Road", continue around to a double viaduct/ railway bridge. Take the right hand arch which leads into Old Wharf Road.

The Salerooms are the first building on the right. There are parking, disabled and loading bays in front of the premises.

For those with SatNav the postcode is NG31 7AA

How to find the Lincoln Auction Rooms



The Thos. Mawer & Son salerooms at Dunston House are situated in central Lincoln on the East end of Portland Street at the foot of Pelham Bridge (Canwick Road.) By car, approaching from the South, take the last turning on the left just before the road rises to the bridge.

Approaching from the North (via Broadgate,) go over the bridge and turn towards Jacksons Building Centre/ Tesco on to Kesteven Street.

Follow the road around to the left and drive under Pelham Bridge to Portland Street. Turn left and you will see Dunston House on the right. Portland Street is also accessible from Lincoln's High Street, opposite the Ritz public house.

The salerooms are within walking distance of the main railway station and bus depot.
